Professor Claire Goodman

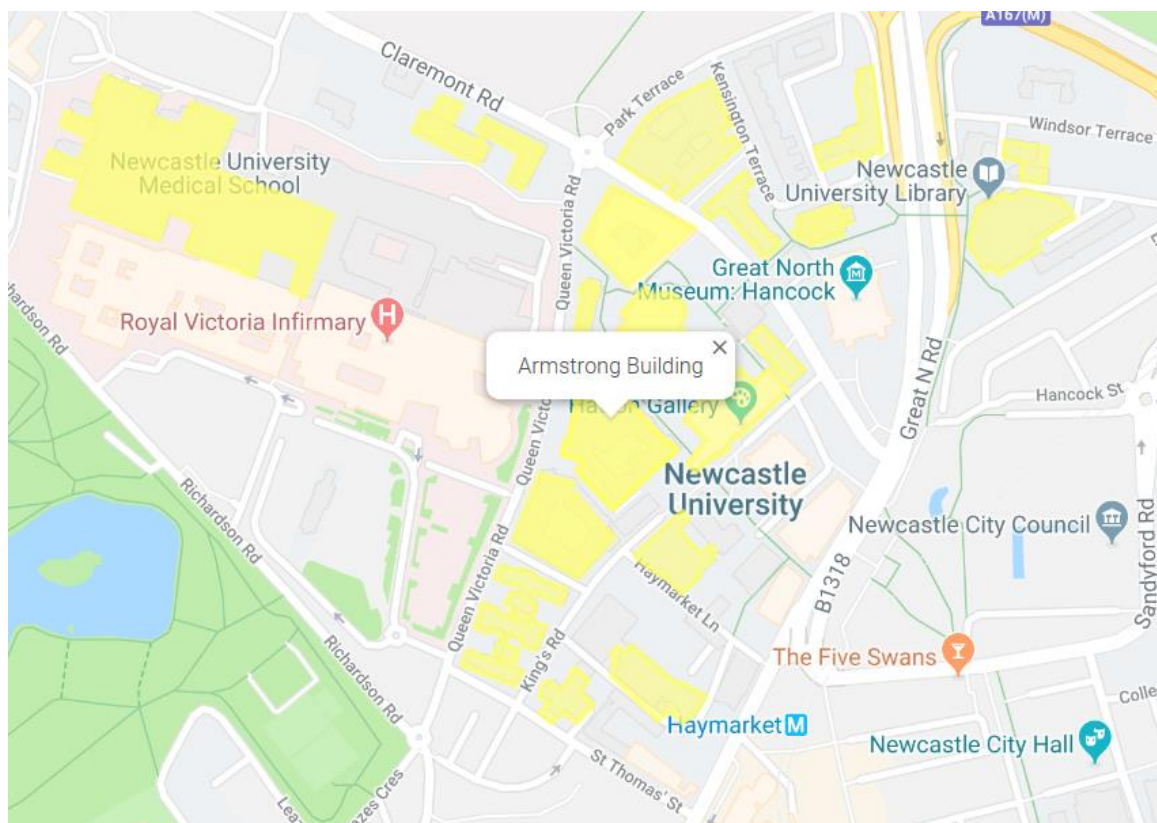
Professor of Health Services Research, University of Hertfordshire
